If you or your child has a cough, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, and/or shortness of breath or has a fever, please do not come or send your child to LOGOS.



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

THE MINISTRY

The Logos Ministry is based upon the spiritual intent of the early Christian church as expressed in the Bible's book of Acts. Right after Pentecost, those who had accepted Christ as Lord and Savior, "devoted themselves to the apostles' teachings and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer" (Acts 2:42). As a result, many LOGOS weekly ministries are composed of four parts that are integrated within a nurturing environment of Christian relationships.

The four parts of the LOGOS weekly ministry:

Worship Skills



Recreation Play

Classes that rotate during each month:

Crafts - 1st Wednesday of the month

Recreation - 2nd, 4th & 5th Wednesday of the month

Mission - 3rd Wednesday of the month (3rd to 12th grade)



BIBLE STUDY - Bible Study nurtures youth and children into intelligent, obedient, and biblically-informed disciples. Each LOGOS class uses a curriculum that is designed to meet their unique needs and learning capabilities.



WORSHIP SKILLS - Worship is essential to the Christian community. In Worship Skills young people learn about worship and prepare to lead in the Sunday morning service of worship. This is typically done through singing, bells, speaking choirs, drama, or movement and dance.



Recreation Play - Recreation Play allows LOGOS young people to experience great fun at the expense of no one else. They participate in games and active play, do crafts, or experience the hobby or special interest of a member of the congregation. When we reveal ourselves in play, we strengthen friendships, and when conflicts occur, we practice our Child of God theology.



Family Time - Family Time provides an opportunity for LOGOS young people to celebrate intergenerational relationships over a shared meal. Children experience being part of the family of God. Young people are assigned to tables with two adults who act as "table parents." The group around the table becomes a family as they share meals together throughout the year. Food is served family style. Conversation is purposeful. Life is celebrated!

LOGOS Policies

ELECTRONICS- *No cell phones or other electronic devices should be used during LOGOS.* The Comforter will keep them safe during the evening, if needed.

ATTENDANCE- Regular weekly attendance and full participation in all parts of the LOGOS program is essential for best results. This is true for children, youth, and adults.

DISMISSAL- Parents need to arrive by 7:45 and sign out their children on Attendance Sheet. Children are brought to Friendship Hall by LOGOS leaders where they meet parents to go home.

GUESTS and VISITORS- Guests considering joining LOGOS may visit 3 weeks in a row before deciding to register. Guests that decide to register will not have to pay the registration fee for the first year.

Middle and High school friends may attend anytime.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE

- **FULFILL** your commitment in your chosen area of LOGOS service. Involvement is required by all parents and has a positive impact on the program and your child.
- **BE PROMPT** in picking your child up at the end of LOGOS. Arrive early to allow fellowship with other parents. Children and leaders are tired and need to head for home without long delays.
- **HELP** your child prepare for parts when they are scheduled to sing, act, or read in worship. It is important that you help your child fulfill his/her commitments by getting him/her to church on time.
- **PARTICIPATE** in and encourage daily Bible and prayer time at your home. Regular Bible reading and prayer must be done in the home. It's not easy to establish such a habit, but a regular time set aside each day will help. Meal times, or just before bed, often prove to be the time most easily kept.
- **ARRANGE** for prompt payment of LOGOS fees.

1. Attend Registration Meeting.
2. Fill out Registration Form .
3. Pay Registration Fee. Make checks payable to FPC with "LOGOS" in memo box
4. Choose an area in which to participate. Parents are required to sign up for some type of supporting participation in the LOGOS Program for the year. An opportunity to indicate preference as to areas of participation is provided at the Registration Meeting.

REGISTRATION FEES

The cost of enrollment covers study materials, meals, equipment, and LOGOS membership.

Registration for Kindergarten - grade 12:

- Child One = \$85
- Child Two = \$75
- Child Three = \$65
- Child Four = Free

Adult Meal Plans

- Cook Team Meal Plan = \$25
- Any adult who participates in the LOGOS program = \$60 (equals \$2.15/meal)
- Any adult who does not participate in the LOGOS program = \$120 (equals \$4.30/meal)

Scholarships are available if financial help is needed. Payment plans are also available. Please talk to Margaret Robateau.



THE LOGOS PROGRAM enables parents to fulfill a portion of the basic responsibilities set by God for them in the raising of their children. Parents are to take an active role in their children's lives and are to help with assignments, encourage them in regular participation, be approachable, counsel with them, and rear them in "the nurture and admonition of the Lord."

Active participation by at least one parent or family member of every child in LOGOS is required. Since the staff is voluntary (except for church staff), part-time service by a large number of people is essential to keep the many activities going. At least as important, however, is the "morale boosting" effect of the parent's physical presence and visible support of the program from time to time. This is a vital element in the successful operation of the LOGOS program.

At the time of registration, either one or both parents (or family member) should fill out a Volunteer Sheet indicating where they are willing to participate.

FOR BEST LOGOS RESULTS....

- **INSIST** upon regular attendance in the program on LOGOS day and special programs on Sunday mornings.
- **COMPLETE** the LOGOS experience by attending worship service on Sundays with your family.
- **STRESS** the importance of courtesy and good behavior at LOGOS. Emphasis on these matters at home will greatly ease the work of our supervision.
- **COMMUNICATE** needs, questions, concerns, as well as positive experiences with your LOGOS Board. Feedback is a key element to a **successful ministry for all those involved**.
- **REMIND** your child to leave toys, ball caps, cell phones, and electronic devices at home. If they forget, a Logos leader will remove the object until the end of the evening's events.
- **CHECK THE THEME CALENDAR** to remind your child to wear a particular color or clothing attire. Keep the monthly calendar posted at home.
